Typhoon "Pedring" entered Philippine Area of Responsibility on 24 September 2011 and moved out of the country on 28 September 2011. It left in its wake the following effects:

A. POPULATION AFFECTED, EVACUATED and SERVED

Total number of population affected in 3,545 barangays/ 312 municipalities / 42 cities in 35 provinces of Regions I, II, III, IV-A, IV-B, V, VI , CAR and NCR is: 651, 889 families / 3, 030,755 persons. Around 58, 747 / 254,412 person are currently served both inside and outside evacuation center:

Inside 64 Evacuation Centers: 5, 764 families / 25, 403 persons Outside Evacuation Centers: 52, 983 families / 229, 009 persons

B. Casualties:

Dead: 83 people Injured: 91 people Missing: 20 people

Rescued/Survivors: 135 people

C. Damages to Properties:

Cost of damage to properties amounted to Php 14,964,489,302.72 broken down as follows:
Infrasrature (Schools / Hospitals / Roads/ Bridges / Others) – Php 2,177,951,972.81
Agriculture (crops, livestock HVCC and Fisheries) – Php 12,786.537,329.91

D. Damaged Houses

A total of $\underline{53.343}$ houses were damaged in Regions I, II, III, IV-A, IV-B, V, VI, and CAR (7,213 totally and 46,130 partially)
