Cabiao is a 1st class municipality in the province of Nueva Ecija, Philippines. According to the latest census, it has a population of 78,000 people in 11,655 households, spread over 23 barangays.

It is located between San Isidro and San Antonio in Nueva Ecija; Magalang, Candaba and Arayat in Pampanga. Northwest is Concepcion, Tarlac. It is about an hour and a half drive from Manila.

Most of Cabiao's agricultural land is being used to cultivate rice. Also, most of the jobs available are related to agriculture.

Out of 78,000 people in Cabiao, an estimated 10,000 are informal settlers who remain in poverty.

All were driven by the idea to build a new

GK village for you. We were able to obtain funds from friends of our association in Germany and from the Ministry of the German Federal Republic. But what is probably even more important is that so many people have helped unselfishly and tirelessly to make this day happen. Let me mention in the first place Fr. Ben Nebres, our dear friend, and his team at Ateneo, led by Noi Queseda. Then Baby Congco who has not only worked in her office as Mayor but has also helped in person to build the houses. I should mention the local GK team and so many volunteers without whom it would have been hard to meet this date. I wish to express our gratitude and appreciation to all of them. I wish to thank in particular His Excellency, the German Ambassador to the Philippines, Thomas Ossowski that he is


is present today despite his full agenda. Last but by far not least, I appreciate your work, dear residents, offered as sweat equity to erect your homes.




Hundreds of families of informal settlers in Broy, Maligaya, Cabiao resided beside an irrigation canal. Their houses were made of scrap materials like corrugated cardboard, used steel roofing, and plastic. These families are at high risk, especially during typhoons. Their houses are washed away during heavy rains because the irrigation canal overflows.


People in the rural areas remain very poor. They earn little from their agricultural jobs, and aren't able to meet the most basic needs, such as education and health. Educational attainment for most does not surpass 3rd Grade in elementary school.

Income is seasonal, brought about by farm labor during planting and harvest time, or work in the rice mills. Some construction work is also available, but this too is irregular.


The community by the numbers

The results here are lifted from a survey administered by Gawad Kalinga - Ateneo and students from the Polytechnic University of the Philippines - Cabiao. A total of 67 families were interviewed for this survey.








From a hopeful youth

Back then, we lived with my in-laws because we didn't have our own home. Our in-laws were kind people who consistently supported us. I will never forget them, and we are very grateful to them.


